### HIP HOP, WESTLAND AND THE ROAD TO EMPOWERMENT

In 2008, Angelo Lamsen became one of the first Inner Winnipeg students to receive a Westland Foundation Scholarship. Growing up in the North End as a new Canadian, he benefited greatly from the extra support he received from the Westland Scholarship during his first year at Red River College studying Business Administration, and is pleased to share his story.

He says, "I was surprised that a Foundation cared about my education as much as I did. The gift of education has nurtured my ambition to rise up from the circumstances I grew up in."

Angelo chose to study business to gain skills and ideas on how to convert his love of hip hop culture into a legitimate and sustainable career. Angelo inspires others by living up to what he considers the principles of hip hop: peace, love, unity, fun, and knowledge. According to Angelo, hip hop exists to combat any oppressive negative circumstances and is a therapeutic means to express one's self. Angelo believes that he is

living proof of the constructive nature of the true hip hop, and faithfully teaches these principles as a key to empowering those who are searching for a positive path.

He says, "I find in today's culture that most people look for the easiest and most comfortable route. We fail to realize that a certain type of struggle is necessary to achieve big things. Experience taught me that first, we develop a vision, then we struggle over obstacles to fulfilling this vision, and finally, through perseverance, we achieve this vision."
